Don't buy this book unless you are a teacher, or your teacher told you to buy it! This edition has no fingerings. If you are teaching yourself the cello (first, please consider getting a teacher. It is very helpful!), this is not the right book for you. My other scale book called "Probably the Only Cello Scale Book You Will Ever Need" is the better choice. It has fingerings for all the scales. This book contains all 24 major and melodic minor scales AND arpeggios. Each scale and arpeggio is shown in 1, 2, and 3 octave forms. It is very hard to find books that have one, two, and three octaves scales shown separately! Also includes some suggested bowing patterns, which are shown at the bottom of the page. Many books are in circle of fifths order, which is less practical. When students are working on F major, an easy scale, you must hunt for it way in the back. This book is organized more relevant to the order in which the scales will be learned. The order (major scales) is C, G, F,

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D, Bb, etc. Each page has all of the scales and arpeggios for that key. This can start conversations about future playing: here's where you will be someday! By having the arpeggios on the same page as the scales, you can easily see the structure of chords as they relate to scales. Students can get confused if they are learning a one octave scale while seeing a two octave scale on the page. It is often hard for them to stop in the middle and pick it back up near the end. The book uses bass, tenor, and treble clefs and would be most helpful for advanced cellists. A prior or simultaneous study of three-octave scales is recommended. By focusing on developing muscle memory, the book can help your hand develop a reliable knowledge of fingerboard geography. While scales teach you the notes in order, they don't cover larger shifts. Arpeggios are one of the best ways to learn bigger distances on the cello. What's in the Book Because this book gives you exercises for three complete sets of traditional fingerings for all of the major and minor arpeggios, the book has something for everyone! As a bonus, the arpeggio workout by Sevcik has been adapted for cello and included to cover an even more comprehensive set of arpeggios.

This book presents the three-octave major and minor arpeggios on the cello, along with numerous variations and exercises that target the specific shifting patterns of each arpeggio. The fingerings that are used take the cellist across strings, helping them to attain a better knowledge of the intermediate positions on low strings. This book works well in conjunction with Three-Octave Scales for the Cello, Book One. This book is intended for use with an instructor, or for use by professional-level cellists.
