This book presents an evidence-based framework for understanding the literacy needs of adolescents. The premise is that educators and other critical stakeholders need to understand evidence-based principles in order to develop effective curricula that meet the needs of diverse learners. Recommendations are provided for middle and secondary education, professional development, education research and policy. At the center of the book are Eight Guiding Principles developed by the authors through a process that included an extensive review of research and policy literature in literacy and related fields, a comparison of national standards documents, and visits to the classrooms of 28 middle and high school teachers across the United States. The Principles are broad enough to encompass a variety of contexts and student needs, yet specific enough to offer real support to those making curriculum development or policy decisions. They provide an overarching structure that districts and teachers can use to develop curricula and curriculum that is both research-based and designed to meet the needs of the learners for whom they are responsible.

Features: Organized to help readers understand empirically supported principles of practice that can be used to address literacy concerns in today's schools, each chapter that addresses one of the eight Principles follows a similar format: \* The Principle is presented along with a brief explanation of the research base and a sample of national standards that support it. \* Case examples spanning a wide variety of disciplines, grade levels, and local conditions - provide an in-depth look at the Principle in action. \* A well-known adolescent literacy expert offers a response to each case example, giving readers an informed perspective on the importance of the Principle, how it is enacted in the cases, and examples of other work related to the Principle. Discussion questions are provided that can be used for individual reflection or group discussion. Principled Practices for Adolescent Literacy is an excellent text for pre-service and in-service upper-elementary, middle and high school literacy methods courses and graduate courses related to adolescent literacy, and as a resource for school district personnel, policymakers and parents.

This book, the second in the series, is a distinct exploration of how educational policy makers, curriculum developers, teachers, learners and social activists can utilize the hitherto untapped rich resource of African traditional oral literature and visual arts. These are epistemological reservoirs and invaluable pedagogical tools in the delivery of content in the classrooms of the global village, most of whom contain diverse student populations from varying backgrounds. The content of the book is intended to help expand educators' repertoire of understanding beyond the hitherto "conventional wisdom", most of which are or are colonial impositions on former colonial entities. Our motivation for pulling together this anthology was due to the fact that scholars, educators and educational policy makers have hitherto paid little attention to the epistemological and pedagogical implications of Traditional Indigenous Knowledge systems (TIKS). Our objective has been largely achieved by this anthology in the sense that the research perspectives of the contributors to this effort have enhanced the hitherto limited exposure and knowledge of oral literature and visual cultures in Africa. The torch that has been lighted from this endeavor heightens the epistemological and pedagogical implications of TIKS. In launching this book, we are extending a clarion call to researchers and disciples of TIKS in Africa and elsewhere to seize this opportunity and interest generated by this endeavor to undertake research studies in this area. Our current efforts were focused mainly on Africa TIKS systems, but we strongly believe that there are and equally powerful and important TIKS systems in other parts of the world, Asia, the Far East, Central and South America, as well as the Caribbean that are longing for exploration and exposition. It is therefore our fervent hope that exploratory research and dissemination of knowledge in this field will continue with the flame lighted from this endeavor. We believe that the book will greatly enhance awareness an otherwise neglected and almost forgotten, but important aspects of knowledge creation and dissemination, especially about traditional and hitherto unwritten histories and knowledge systems around the world. Our undertakings will help to broaden the conceptualization of what constitutes global knowledge within the current reality of globalization.

**John McEwen, thirty-seven years a politician, twenty-three days a Prime Minister and always a farmer, was an extraordinary mix of a man. His staff revered him and his adversaries feared him.
